# Unite and Heal

In his victory speech, President-elect Biden vowed to be President for all Americans, and called for us to unite and heal.

This isn't some trite platitude, nor a call for superficial niceties, and certainly not a request to compromise on our beliefs. We need to understand why more than 70 million Americans supported Trump to the very end, not just to unite and heal, but to ensure that our party is able to anticipate and respond to the needs of millions of voters.

A call for unity is not an invitation to "meet half way" on issues of basic dignity and human rights. Some things can't be tolerated: racism, violence, stoking division for partisan gain, kids in cages, disregarding truth, ignoring experts, and humiliating career public servants are among the many indignities our nation has suffered over the past four years.

There should be consequences for leaders, in their electoral and public lives, for engaging in and enabling such conduct.

However, we shouldn't demonize any ordinary Americans - our friends, family, and neighbors - who hold genuine and deeply held convictions informed not by malice but by love of country. We need thoughtful conversation and introspection on both sides. Let's work to see the common humanity of those who have a conservative political philosophy but reject Trump's shameless manipulation and exaltation of the darkest aspects of human nature.

### **Challenges Ahead**

While we take time to celebrate our victories, we face great challenges as a country and a movement.

We'll need to win one or both of the Senate seats in Georgia to avoid the Mitch McConnell road block in the Senate.

We've reclaimed the White House, but our House majority has narrowed, heading into a midterm election in which the President's party most commonly loses seats. Will we allow the House, which we fought so hard in 2018 to retake, to fall into Republican hands? If you need two words to help you focus try these: Speaker McCarthy.

Meanwhile, we face myriad challenges, many of which grew worse during Trump's term, including a surging pandemic, an economic recession, ever growing income inequality, the existential threat of the climate crisis, systemic racism, and others.

There's a hard road ahead, but as Joe Biden has said, there isn't anything Americans can't do if we work together.

### **Our Campaign 2020 by the Numbers**

While we have much to do, let's take a moment to acknowledge our hard work and the results we've achieved, including:

- With the help of 800 phone bank volunteers, made over 310,000 calls and reached 32,000 voters in order to elect Joe Biden and Kamala Harris and to flip the Senate
- Wrote and sent 15,000 postcards to voters in North Carolina and Virginia
- Locally, we sent slate mailers to over 100,000 Democrats in Santa Clara County, reaching voters in every corner of the County
- Sent 2,500 postcards, 40,000 emails, and 45,000 text messages, and placed 3,500 calls to Democrats in Santa Clara County to support our local candidates
