

Stop the Republican Recall

Dear Democrat,

With the recall election only five weeks away, it's clear that voter turnout will be crucial if Gov. Gavin Newsom is to hold on to his job - and if Californians are to hold on to good governance.

California is overwhelmingly Democratic, but this will mean nothing if we can't turn out our voters for the Sep. 14 election. Special elections are driven by oppositional voices and this one is no different: a



recent poll showed that while 90% of Republicans expressed a strong interest in the recall election, only 58% of Democrats did. In the same poll, Newsom had only a slim 3-point margin among likely voters.

So with ballots set to be mailed to voters next week, SCC Dems have organized a range of opportunities for activists. Pick what works for you – doorknob literature drops, virtual phone banking, canvassing, or voter registration tabling.

We have fought too hard for our recent gains to lose ground now. Let's join together to preserve sane public policy in our state, and forward momentum going into the 2022 midterm elections on which control of Congress rests.

Doorknob literature drops start Aug. 17

Volunteer in our Neighborhood Captain Program. You will need to commit to drop literature to 100 of your Democratic neighbors between Aug. 17 and the end of this month. Sign up here. We will then contact you to provide a training of approximately 5 minutes and all the materials you will need.

Virtual phone banking starts Aug. 18

From Aug. 18 through Sep. 12, we will be partnering with the Kings County Dems to call voters in our two counties every Sunday afternoon and Wednesday evening with the exception of Labor Day weekend. For a final push, we will add more phone banks from Sep. 11 through Election Day. Join us on Zoom, where we provide the training and support you need to help turn out the vote.

Canvassing on Aug. 21

<u>Canvass</u> on Aug. 21 with the SCC Dems and the South Bay Labor

Council. We'll start at 9 a.m. with a short rally and training before heading to nearby San Jose neighborhoods to drop literature and, at each volunteer's option, to talk to voters in a COVID-safe manner. Help encourage our voters to cast their ballots. Lunch will be provided as we conclude our walk.

Voter registration tabling

Sign up to help staff one of our voter registration tables at various community locations. We will contact you with a list of locations and times when available.

Savor the Biden Presidency's accomplishments


