Volunteer Highlight: Rebecca Sayed


Rebecca Sayed still remembers a local newspaper photo from the 60s, of her mom marching with farmworkers while pushing Rebecca, a baby at the time, in a buggy. That march was only one among many political events Rebecca's mom took her to as she was growing up.

"She dragged me along everywhere," Sayed joked.

Somewhere along the way, Sayed picked up the activism bug too.

With her leadership, the SCCDP just concluded its postcarding campaign for the upcoming midterm elections. At the beginning of October, the

campaign mailed 15,000 postcards prepared by an army of volunteers into strategically-important congressional districts in the Central Valley and the Santa Clarita area.



Since its launch after 2016, the phonebanking team has made calls for Joe Biden, Josh Harder, Gavin Newsom and others. Currently, it's working to notch crucial November wins in the Central Valley, Arizona and Nevada.

With captains, tech leads and chat moderators, the team is well-run. Sayed works hard to keep it that way, knowing that volunteers won't return otherwise.

She also works hard to keep it fun: in the summer of 2021, she hosted a party at her house for the top phonebankers as well as for the phonebank captains.

Sayed loves the people she meets through her political activism, because, she says, "they're all doing this out of the goodness of their hearts."
