Resolution Calling on the City of San Jose to Stop Underserving Our Community

WHEREAS the City of San Jose should be a model for employment and City Services in our State; and

WHEREAS the city of San Jose currently has over 860 vacant city jobs, which significantly impacts services to residents and the workload and wellbeing of city staff, and according to the most recent Annual Report on City Services, San José employs 6.8 people per 1,000 residents—fewer than any other large California city and fewer than neighboring cities like Santa Clara, which currently has 7.68 filled positions per 1,000 city residents,¹ and the City of San Jose also reports an annual employee turnover rate of 14% and struggles to retain and hire staff in critical city services,² and

WHEREAS for each of the last 10 fiscal years, the City of San Jose consistently accrued large budget surpluses driven by understaffing, delayed projects, and deferred services as follows:

General fund expenditure savings by year:

2012-2013: \$62 million³ 2013-2014: \$87 million⁴ 2014-2015: \$90 million⁵ 2015-2016: \$91.86 million⁶ 2016-2017: \$91.5 million⁷ 2017-2018: \$66.7 million⁸ 2018-2019: \$89.7 million⁹ 2019-2020: \$126.5 million¹⁰ 2020-2021: \$159.9 million¹¹ 2021-2022: \$180.3 million,¹²

these budget surpluses having been largely driven by understaffing and currently over \$178 million is budgeted for vacant positions in the city;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Santa Clara County Democratic Party calls upon the leadership in the City of San Jose to end its pattern of accruing large budget savings by not providing services and to stop understaffing our community, and further calls on the elected Democrats the leadership in the City of San Jose to uphold our shared values of supporting working families and good jobs.
